Whatever it takes to complete an obligation is in itself an obligation." (Iqitidaa Siratul Mustaqeem, 1/470)

"Verily We revealed it, an Arabic recitation, so you may comprehend..." (Al-Qur'aan 12:2)

"...as such We revealed to you a Qur'aan in Arabic..." (Al-Qur'aan 26:7)

Allah also said:

"...and verily it is a revelation from the Lord of the worlds, the trustworthy spirit revealed it upon your heart so you may be a Warner in a great Arabic tongue." (Al-Qur'aan 26:192-195)

Allah also said:

"A Book in which the verses are explained, an Arabic Qur'an for a people who know well." (Al-Qur'aan 41:3)

So when Arabic language has such a high station and is of great importance as mentioned above. Allah most high has taken the responsibility of preserving it as he took the responsibility to preserve the Qur'aan. Allah said:

"Verily We sent down the reminder (Qur'aan) and verily We will preserve it."
